

NOTICE OF PROPOSED CHANGES IN THE
REGULATIONS OF DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE

The Department of Revenue proposes to adopt regulation changes in Title 15 of the Alaska Administrative Code, dealing with use of confidential information in the Department's possession, including the following:

15 AAC 05.260 provides that the department may disclose confidential information to interested parties involved in a dispute relating to oil and gas property valuations under AS 43.56.

You may comment on these proposed regulation changes, including the potential costs to private persons of complying with the proposed changes, by submitting written comments to James Greeley, State Petroleum Property Tax Assessor, Tax Division, 550 W. Comments must be received no later than 5:00 PM, February 17, 2009. Written comments received are public records and are subject to public inspection.
