

NOTICE OF PROPOSED CHANGES IN THE
REGULATIONS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE

Brief Description

BRIEF DESCRIPTION

The Department of Revenue proposes to change regulations addressing common property fishery assessment. The change sets the tax assessment rate for calendar year 2013.

The Department of Revenue proposes to adopt regulation changes in Title 15 of the Alaska Administrative Code, dealing with common property fishery assessment, including the following:

- (1) 15 AAC 116.415 addresses the calendar year 2013 assessment rate.

You may comment on the proposed regulation changes, including the potential costs to private persons of complying with the proposed changes, by submitting written comments to James Fletcher at the Department of Revenue at 550 West 7th Avenue, Suite 500, Anchorage, Alaska, 99501.
